• Philippians can be both inspiring and challenging. How are you feeling so far? • What of the "if any's" (Phil. 2:1) have you experienced most? • Paul's highest priority for the Philippian Christians seems to be loving unity. What other values seem to compete for #1 priority in churches? Discuss the hymn Paul quotes in detail. note the significant descent of Christ • note the dual nature of Christ (divine and human). • note the "chiastic" structure of the hymn: how first stanza is connected to the last, the second to the seventh, and so on. How does Christ's example shift your perspective on what it means to love?

How?

The Hymn:

- •Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be used to his own advantage;
 - rather, he made himself nothing by taking the very natureof a servant, being made in human likeness.
 - And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself
 - **8** by becoming obedient to death—even death on a cross!
 - ^b Therefore God exalted him to the highest place and gave him the name that is above every name,
 - b that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth,

and every tongue acknowledge that Jesus Christ is O Lord, to the glory of God the Father.
